

OSPREY FLY BOX

COHO UV BUGGER

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This Coho or Cutthroat Bugger pattern has two things going for it. One, its very easy to tie and two, it really works.

I first started fishing this pattern on the Nicomen Slough and the Harrison River for Fall Coho, but is also a great Cutthroat pattern as well.

This fly is best fished on a Clear tip or a Slime Line.



MATERIALS



Hook: Streamer Hook - 3XL. Sizes #6 to #10

Bead: Copper sized to match Hook size

Thread: Uni 6/0 Olive, Black or Purple

(to match body colour)

Body: Hareline UV Polar Chenille – Olive Copper UV,

Black UV or Purple UV

TYING INSTRUCTIONS



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- 1. Debarb the hook, place a Copper Bead on the Hook. Start the 6/0 Thread, to match the body colour, and cover the hook shank down to the crushed Barb and then back up to the Bead.
- 2. Tie in the UV Polar Chenille behind the Bead and bind it down to the Crushed Barb and then return the thread to the Bead.
- Wind the UV Polar Chenille up to the Bead remembering to sweep the fibres back toward the Hook point with each turn. Tie off the Chenille and cut the excess.





TYING INSTRUCTIONS

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- 4. To aid in tying a whip finish without trapping fibres, place a segment of Drinking Straw cut lengthways over the Thread and slide it over top of the Chenille.
- 5. Complete with a whip finish and the use your preferred glue, head cement etc. to finish the fly.
