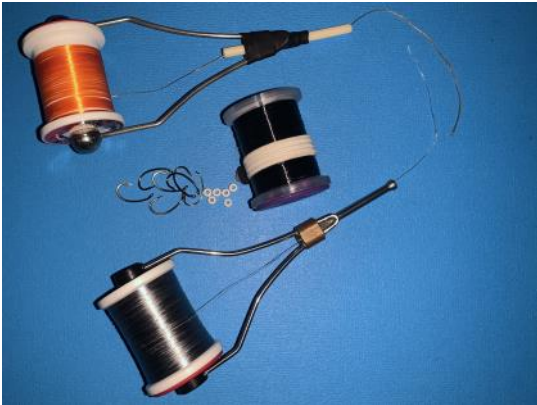
The Whiskey Dick Chironomid is a fly I had a lot of success with at last spring's Osprey fish out at Tunkwa Lake.

Best success was with the Size 12 Hook fished about one foot off the bottom under an indicator.

Tie some up and see if this fly works as well for you as it did for me.



MATERIALS



- Hook:** Togens Scud Hook, Sizes #10 to #12
- Bead:** White Tungsten 2.8 mm (10) or 2.4mm (12)
- Thread:** UTC 70 Blue Dun
- Rib:** Black Wire - Small.
- Thorax:** UTC 70 Burnt Orange

TYING INSTRUCTIONS



1. Pinch the Barb, Place the Bead on the Hook with the large opening away from the hook eye. Start the thread on the hook behind the Bead and bind the Black wire down to the pinched Barb.



2. Place several wraps of thread below the Wire and then form a slender tapered body up to the Bead. Place a single whip on the Blue Dun Thread and attach the Burnt Orange thread. Cut the Blue Dun Thread.



3. Wire the Black Wire 6 or 7 times up the Hook to the bead. Tie off and Helicopter the Wire to Break it Off.



4. Form a small Thorax with the Burnt Orange Thread and whip finish. Coat the whole fly with Sally Hansen's Hard As Nails.
