Registered Guests enjoy all the benefits of club membership for one year.


METHOD SESSIONS

One of the primary reasons to join a fishing club is to LEARN. The methods sessions are a "melting pot" where large amounts of information are shared by seasoned fly anglers. **You never stop learning**.

For anyone new to the sport, these sessions will be particularly valuable.

On the third Wednesday of the month, the club holds a Methods Session during which a presentation will be made on a specific topic.

- Fly Tying Instruction Steelhead, Trout, Salmon, Cutthroat, Stillwater, Rivers & Streams, Epoxy, Spey Flies, Tube Flies, Intruders, etc. Learn not only "how to tie", but "what to tie" for an upcoming fish out.
- Casting Technique Casting games and spey claves. Pick up tips on improving your casting.
- Other Related Skills Framing & mounting your flies, rod building, splicing lines, etc.
- Latest & Greatest Company reps bring in some of the latest products being introduced to the industry. Rods, reels, lines, fly tying products, etc.



FISH OUTS

Looking for someone to fish with?

The club holds fish outs year round, usually on a monthly basis. These may be local day trips or extended trips to other regions of the province.

NEWSLETTER

The club newsletter, the "Osprey News", is available to members and registered guests, and is produced on a monthly basis from September through June. The newsletter keeps members and guests up to date on the current activities of the club, as well as providing interesting articles, fly tying patterns and instruction.

MEMBERSHIP

You'll find that the Osprey Flyfishers have a broad and diverse membership.

You'll notice that the primary focus of some members is conservation and the environment. Others are primarily interested in learning, by way of the methods sessions, and fishing.

Regardless of your motivation, you will find members that share the same goals and values that you do.

The Osprey Flyfishers have adopted a policy of controlled membership growth. Growth is monitored and decided upon by the membership, semi-annually. The club generally votes in favor of active fly fishers who are willing and eager to participate in the affairs and operations of the club.

BECOMING A MEMBER

The Registration Form is a two part form.

Part One is information about you. Complete that and submit it to the Membership Director.

On Part Two (which you keep), you will record the dates and details of Osprey functions that you attend, the name of your Member Sponsor and the date you were sponsored.

As a registered guest, you must attend three regular meetings, three method sessions and two other events (fish outs, casting sessions, club sponsored events) and obtain a sponsor by the third closed meeting of the club (12 to 18 months).

Upon meeting the requirements for membership, your name will be put forward for membership at the next closed meeting of the club *(either April or November)*. Your sponsor will be expected to speak on your behalf regarding your application.
